 - * "學生個人成績暨分數百分比對照表" must be original with official seal of your school. Certification offered by the "大學甄選入學委員会" is not necessary.
 - * If you studied in several schools, submit the documents that have same content as "學生個人成績暨分數百分比對照表" of all the high schools in which you studied.
